Project idea

Project proposal and description

Patients receive a variety of implanted devices but due to lack of integration of hospital IT systems information about the devices is not readily available

We propose a voluntary app where patient can self-enter (manually, QR code reader, scanning, OCR, etc.) their health information data (primarily implantable device information) – this way they always have information with them when needed (i.e. physician visits, emergencies)

App needs to be patient-centered and voluntary – it is patient's ultimate decision to enter data in the app

Current problem solution (images, charts, notebooks, etc.)

The need for the App - why, how, when?

There are 1,000,000 stent procedures annually in the US and multifold worldwide- this will improve patient communication and follow-up

App can track movement and provide additional data

App can link to credit card data and allow for big data research

App can allow for direct-to-consumer advertising

App can link to US News/World report hospital rankings, Doximity, phyisician ratings

App can link to various heart rate and blood pressure monitoring apps/devices

Potential App Objectives

Provide patient-initiated data storage for critical health information

Potential App Contributions

For patients – always have critical data on you

For physicians – similar to patients – always have access to critical data

Device companies – access to data, access to product recall, new devices advertising, research

Advertisers - direct-to-patient advertising, Collect data on patient movement, spending habits

FDA – device recall, device tracking




Patient has a heart stent procedure (in the hospital)




Patient goes to recovery room and discusses the procedure
